SHERBROOKE COWL





Named for the small village of Sherbrooke, on the eastern shore of Nova Scotia, this cowl combines a simple twin rib with a special yarn to create a classic cool weather accessory. The cowl provides warmth without the bulk of a scarf. This cowl is extra long, allowing the wearer to pull the cowl over the head as a hood/neckwarmer combination.

- Needles: Size US 8 (5.0mm) 16" circular needles
- Yarn: 2 skeins of The Fibre Company Terra in "Green Tea" colorway, or similar weight yarn (heavy worsted), approximately 200 yds / 182 m for full length.
- Gauge: 18 stitches = 4 inches, not critical
- Notions: Stitch marker, darning needle

Cast on 60 stitches loosely, using long-tail cast on, or preferred method. This cast on provides a snug fit, if you would like a looser fit, please cast on 70 stitches.

Join the pattern in the round, placing a stitch marker at the beginning of the row.

Establish pattern as follows:

Row 1: *Knit 5, Purl 5, repeat from * Row 2: *Knit 2, Purl 2, repeat from *

Continue in pattern until the cowl is a good fit. Bind off loosely, and weave in ends. Cowl in photograph measures approximately 18 inches / 47.5 cm.

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
